

## “I-Spy”

### Materials Needed:

- Plastic bottle
- Rice
- Funnel
- Small knick-knack items such as:
  - Buttons
  - Coins
  - Paper clips
  - A birthday candle
  - Beads
  - Erasers
- Glue

### Instructions:

- Collect knick-knacks in a variety of colors that can fit into the bottle opening
- Make a list of the knick-knacks you choose which will be the “spy card”
- Fill the bottles with rice and your trinkets leaving enough room for the rice to slide around
- Glue the lid closed
- Kids can find everything on the list or as many items of one color

## “Ocean in a Bottle”

### Materials Needed:

- Plastic bottle
- Funnel
- Water
- Blue food coloring
- Glitter
- Optional add-ins: sea shells, colored stones, small toy fish, etc.
- Cooking oil
- Glue

### Instructions:

- Fill 1/3 of bottle with water
- Add several drops of food coloring
- Shake to mix food coloring
- Add glitter and/or knick-knacks
- Fill to the top with oil
- Glue the lid shut
- Tip the bottle and watch the ocean swirl

## “Deep Breath Dragon”

### Materials Needed:

- Scissors
- Cup
- White paper
- Black markers
- Tape/ glue
- Streamers

### Instructions:

- Tape or glue streamers to big end of cup inside
- Have child blow into bottom of cup
